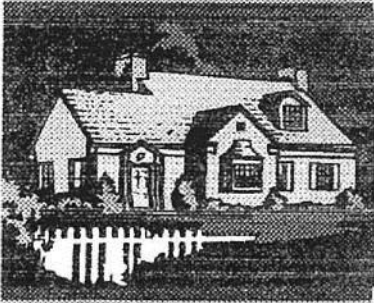

We have worked on traffic issues including speed controls and we worked very closely with all parties on the Coors/I40 Project. I believe that SRMNA got the best of this project! You will see the direct impact from our work with Councilor Sanchez and the city with the installation of the street light at the corner of 57th 4:34 Ouray. This will help with the traffic congestion coming in and out from our neighborhood. SRMNA is working with developers and the city to get better shopping and eating opportunities for our area. We have requested and will receive a new association sign that will be placed on the corner of 72nd and Ladera. (THANK YOU Councilor Sanchez for getting us the funding for our new sign) We listened to your concerns and have requested that Councilor Ken Sanchez appropriate monies to landscape the median on Ladera from 72nd east to Ouray. Councilor Sanchez is also helping us figure out what to do with the dirt lot left on Ladera/Ouray after our final subdivision was built. The city worked with SAMNA to set the standard for neighborhood association signage; we were the first with the sign on Ouray and 65th. SRMNA would love to get more involved with Susie Rayos Marmon Elementary School. We would like to see volunteers (hopefully with neighbors that have students at the school) to form a committee to work closely with the school and help with any needs they may have. When a neighborhood association works with a school it adds thousands of voices that lawmakers listen to. If anyone is interested in starting this committee please call the SRMNA message line and we can get this going. These are just a few things that your association does for your neighborhood. Please GET INVOLVED, we would *welcome* new board members, so SRMNA can be the best Neighborhood Association in the city.

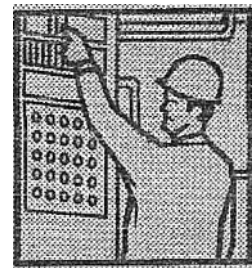
